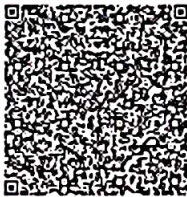

THIS TRUST DEED IS MADE AT NEW DELHI ON Date 25/08/2022 Between Shri Radhesh Krishan, Age-29, S/O-Shri Arun Kumar Chaudhary, PRESENT R/O H. No.- G-25, G/F , BACK SIDE, KIRAN GARDEN, UTTAM NAGAR , NEW DELHI -110059., Permanent R/O Kolhanta Patori, Kolhatta P. Basant, Darbhanga, Bihar-846003.

Here in after called the "SETTLOR" (which expression shall unless repugnant to or inconsistent with the subjects or on text of meaning there of include his heirs, Executors and administrators) of ONE PART

And

1. SHRI ARUN KUMAR CHAUDHARY, AGE-46, S/O-SHRI AMBIKA CHAUDHARY, R/O PATORI, P. BASANT, DARBHANGA, BIHAR-846003

WHEREAS THE SETTLOR above named has been desirous of creating and establishing an Devotional and Educational charitable Trust. The settler of the Trust will be the chairman of the Trust (**RADHESH KRISHAN**). He will preside all over the meetings and works of the Trust. Final decision of the Trust shall be taken by the Settler.

AND WHEREAS THE SETTLOR above named has settled a sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees TEN THOUSAND ONLY) as a fund for the Trust,

AND WHEREAS THE SETTLOR above named has settled the assets and properties mentioned in the Schedule hereunder,

AND WHEREAS THE TRUSTEES named are willing to accept the office of the Trustees for the purpose of carrying out the of the **SETTLOR** of the Trust under the provisions and directions set forth herein, so as to enable to pursue its vowed objects.

THIS DEED WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS

The **SETTLOR** above named hereby establishes a **Public Charitable Trust** by the name of "**SAMVEDNA**" for the purpose and upon the conditions set forth here under.

- 1) The **TRUSTEES** named above shall be the first trustees and have given their consent to be appointed as the trustees and as token thereof, they have set their hands to this instrument.
- 2) The **SETTLOR** hereby conveys, transfers and assigns to the **TRUSTEES** the above referred sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rs TEN THOUSAND ONLY) as corpus to the **TRUST**, the receipt of which, the **TRUSTEES** do hereby admit and acknowledge.
- 3) The **SETTLOR** of the Trust hereby conveys, transfers, assigns to the **TRUSTEES** the assets and properties mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the possession of which the Trustees hereby admit and acknowledge, to have and to hold the same in trust as corpus of the Trust, to be used by the Trustees to carry out and fulfill the objects of the Trust set forth herein, and the **SETTLOR** of the Trust hereby for all time any claim to or interest in the said assets and properties or fund forming the subject matter of the Trust.
- 4) Branches of the trust shall be opened in every state of the country at district level or block and ward of panchayat level for the welfare of the people as per the decision taken by the managing board of the trust.

The **TRUSTEES** do hereby agree that they shall hold and stand possessed of the said trust assets, properties and funds (which expression shall include all investments in cash or kind or in any nature whatsoever into and for which, the said property or a part or parts thereof may from time to time be converted, varied or exchanged) and/ or such investments as may be held by the **TRUSTEES** from time to time in relation to these presents together with all income, profits, additions and accretions thereof, upon trust for the object set out herein with and subject to the provisions and conditions hereinafter contained in these presents.

MEMORANDUM OF TRUST

Implementation of all the ideals mentioned above will include:

I. OBJECTIVES:

To corporate Govt. and health department in reforming, developing, and promoting the Indian standards of medical services in every field.
9. Establishment of institution and other centers of Learning / Teaching / Consultancy / Training. For Religious, Spiritualism, Yoga, Psychology, Research & Development, Para Normal Science, Science & Technology, Space Science, Life after Death and Super natural objects and powers which are wonder for the common man.
10. To check and eradicate the corruption undisciplined or quarrel between the teaching staffs and students or between the non teaching staffs for making peaceful and corruption free atmosphere in the education systems/ university campus , colleges schools and society.
11. To channelized youth energy for eradication of social evils in the society so that they may become important part of our society and achieve peaceful nature of human being.
12. To collaborate with any other organization having similar aims and objects
13. To check and eradicate corruption, undisciplined and quarrel in the Govt. department as well as private or public sector for making peaceful and corruption free atmosphere in the society.

 33. To receive grants, donations, gifts, membership subscription/contributions, raise funds and loans it necessary for carrying out activities of the rust from individuals, institutions, business houses, government and non-government agencies and other sources in India and abroad.
 34. To start Vocational & Professional training centers for repairing TV, Radio, watches, coolers, video, VCR, VCD, DVD, Fans electronic items, photography, scooter, car/jeep repairing and related works etc. and to guide and assist members tor self-employment and employment in Govt./semi-Government and private jobs etc.
 35. To carry out the aptitude text of the students and guide them as per their interest and aptitude & to make the students aware of the career opportunities available in the various fields. To carry out personality development courses to make the youth self confident.
 36. To establish and run educational institutions including applied research and development in education; medical; engineering, information technology, management & other emerging areas.
 37. To seek as well as provide financial support to supplement infrastructure in needy existing educational institutions, to include setting up of hostels/libraries/class-rooms and funding educational aids.
 38. To impart basic and alternate education & to provide scholarships to deserving and needy children.
 39. To import Vocational training to rural youth for development employing skills of international standard in marine and service industries.
 40. To conduct coaching classes for preparing rural youth to compete tor job opportunities in Government and Private sector.

To provide adult education to uneducated adults and to conduct awareness program in the local community to throw light on the problems regarding health, sanitation and current social and social economic problems related to women and children including ex-dowry. Child labor, alcoholism and drug addiction etc.
54. To provide low-cost technical expertise for setting up income generation ventures.
55. To organize & provide legal service to needy the underprivileged & undertake or assist genuine Public Interest Litigation.
56. To organize and manage relief efforts in disaster situations.
57. To aid other organizations in providing relief to disaster hit communities.
58. To help out servicemen/ex-service and their widows and children in all possible manners.
59. To establish small trades and give aid in this direction so that charity institutes, other related group may be benefited.
60. To act as surveyor contractor, advisor for charitable institutes. Granting benefits at the time of need to the Beneficiaries. Rendering financial support to Beneficiaries who have for one reason or the other, fallen into distress.
61. To aid and promote educational and vocational learning facilities/activities for the Beneficiaries.
62. To advance as a loan or stipend or grants to the Beneficiary for the purpose of education at approved institutions as per criteria laid down by the Board of Societies. Providing for the welfare of the Beneficiaries on case to case basis with the discretion of Board to render financial support.
63. To promote social, cultural and sports activities among the beneficiaries as per the approval of the Board of Societies. Taking all measures necessary for fulfillment of the above mentioned objectives.

To start establish, run, take over or manage and maintain the schools, with the objective to provide sound Nursery, Pre-Primary, Middle, Secondary, Sr. Secondary and Higher education to children/students by seeking recognition and affiliation from the education departments, including International affiliations with other International Educational Institutions/ Departments, Boards, Universities etc.
67. To establish and run Homes/shelters for the Orphan Children, Destitute, Widows, Old Age people, Minorities including SC/STs and Tribal's etc., laying emphasis on the Welfare of the Females.
68. To establish and run Homes/shelters for wounded and stray animals. These shelters would also cater the need for even the wounded and stray animals especially the Cows.
69. To run, maintain, organize, and assist in running any property for charitable activities, donated or transferred whether in pieces or in part or in full or any property the rights of which have been transferred to this Society for charitable activities as per conditions laid down by the donor. The Society is empowered to accept existing properties being used for charitable purpose anywhere in India and then run the same for the objects for which it has been created or settled.
70. To receive financial and non-financial assistance from Govt./Non Govt. organizations, International Agencies, Bank and any other legal entity or individuals for its objectives.
71. To erect, construct, alter, maintain, lease, mortgage, transfer, improve, develop, manage and control all or any part of the property or the building of the above Society, necessary or convenient for all purpose for the attainment of the Aims and Objects of the Society.
72. To assist and co-operate with other Associations, Societies, and N.G.Os. ,whose aims are more or less similar to this Society
73. To start, maintain and assist any relief measures in those parts which are or become subjected to natural calamities such as flood, fire, drought, famine, cyclone earthquake, epidemic, storm accident, pestilence etc.
74. To open, establish, run and manage, control, assist and supervise Old Age homes/Senior Citizens homes in order to shelter/help the inmates and/or aid to the suffering and/or also for rehabilitation of the inmates;
75. To open, establish, run and manage, control, assist and supervise Hospital Medical and Charitable dispensaries, widow homes, orphanage, lunatic asylums, maternity homes, child wolfish centers, ashrams in order to help the inmates and/or aid to the suffering and/or also for rehabilitation of the inmates;
76. To provide all types of latest technique and method of treatment including Medicine, Surgery, Physiotherapy, Rehabilitation; To standardize diagnostic procedures as necessary; To aid, help in procuring medicines, treatment etc; incase or in service or in-kind; To undertake the management and conduct of institutions, hospitals, clinics, medical and training centers and such other organizations having similar objectives; or the wolfish of the people.

78. To set up, run and maintain hospital based on naturopathy/allopathic Homeopathy/any other systems of medicine and dispensaries to provide medical relief and aid to general public;
79. To provide free accommodation, clothes food to the old aged and socially discarded persons, accommodated/admitted in the Society homes;

9. To engage the inmates of Society's homes in various assignments according to their ability/intelligence/hobby for the upliftment of general public;
80. To establish, set up, build, run and maintain Yog Sadhana Kendra and Meditation centers for the benefits of General public.
81. To encourage, undertake, assist, organize and seminars, conferences, publish materials for the welfare of animals, veterinary clinics, Hospitals, shelters or to do anything conducive to their well-beings.
82. To give, provide and/or render help and assistance in cash or kind to poor and/or destitute people, widow, old person's etc;
83. To give, provide and/or render help and assistance to and/or implement any scheme for providing livelihood and upliftment of the poor of all class/community including adoption of any particular district for economic/social development as per the Govt. approvals/schemes.
84. To start, maintain and assist any relief measures in those parts which is or become subjected to natural calamities such as flood, fire, drought, famine, cyclone earthquake, epidemic, storm accident, pestilence etc;
85. To spend any portion of the corpus or the income of the Society fund for the land and/or constructing any building or buildings, for and in the name of the Society for the purpose of carrying out promoting and/or executing any or all of the objects of the Trust.

The members may appoint Secretaries, Managers, Lawyers, Solicitors, Auditors Architects, Engineers, Surveyors, Gomastas or other employees for the purpose of Management and supervisor of the estate for collection of rent, effects and profits for keeping the accounts and records and for other purpose of the Society.
87. To invest monies in the name of the Society not immediately required in such manner as has been prescribed in the Income Tax Act from time to time or shall at their discretion or realize the same or any part thereof.
88. To establish, manage, promote, computer education centers/institutions in various places for the general public.
89. To arrange, establish, open and run institution for B.Ed., J.B.T., BCA, MCA, and Nursery Teachers Training Centers etc. with the approval of concerned authorities.
90. To work for the development/upliftment of S.C., S.T., O.B.C. and such other Backward Classes/Minority Communities.
91. To distribute among poor students free text books, help books, exercise books, dress and other material, provide them other facilities deemed proper from time to time.
92. To manage and pledge of or deal with movable and immovable properties of the Society keeping in view of the aims and objects of the Society.
93. To start, establish, run or manage and maintain schools with an object to provide sound pre-primary, secondary, and senior secondary education including vocational and technical education to children by seeking recognition and affiliation from the educational departments of various states.

107. To collect information Notices, Notifications, Policies from the Government, Semi-Government, National/International Agencies and NGOs industry provide the same to the members of the Society and the general public.
108. To organize seminars, meeting, press conference and other level gatherings. The Society should not have any relation / associate with any political party.
109. To eradicate social malpractices as; Dowry, Child Marriage, Pardah System, Superstition, Corruption and to work for moral / character building.
110. To promote National Integration, Communal Harmony, Universal Brotherhood and Global Peace.
111. To promote and advocate Human Rights and Fundamental Freedom for all without any discrimination of race, religion, caste, color, sex and language.
112. To promote charitable values, literature, science, art, education and culture.
113. To undertake, organize, conduct and facilitate, Courses, conference, lecture, research and education on various aspects and of science, technology, society and other fields.
114. To train the downtrodden people in general for human resource development in view of the emerging needs such as database development, resource survey methodologies, computer, environmental, studies, health, education, and energy problems.
115. To stablish nirogjjivan healthcare for health parpus like health card, medical camp. pertaining to the objectives of the society. To protest and fight against the injustice against people.
116. To aid or establish any institution technical or otherwise, to promote education of art, Science or other related fields for the benefit of downtrodden and weaker sections of the society.
117. To arrange and provide medical aid and other assistance necessary for living to the needy people who are incapable or handicapped or mentally/physically retarded and financially unfit.
118. To start and assist the relief measures in those parts of the country which become effected to natural calamities like famine, fire flood, earthquakes etc.

VI. PROPERTIES:

The Trust properties shall consist of

1. The amount Transferred by the SETTLOR with the consent of other trustees as mentioned above, towards the Corpus fund of the Trust.
2. The immovable properties and other assets settle by SETTLOR with the consent of The President as mentioned above.
3. Any cash, kind, properties, movable and immovable that may be acquired by or otherwise or all manner of rights, title or interest in or over any property movable or immovable
4. All additions and accretions to the Trust properties and the income there from

5. All donations, gifts, legacies or grants, in cash or kind accepted by the Trustees upon Trust. The properties of the Trust shall be utilized for the objects set forth herein above and subject to the provisions and conditions herein mentioned.

VII. NUMBER OF TRUSTEES, THEIR TERM AND POWER TO CO-OPT:

1. The Trust will be managed by a Board of Trustees consisting of not less than 2 trustees and not more than 3 trustees. The parties of the Second Part will be First Trustees and they shall automatically form the Board of Trustees and the first board of trust is the founder member of the trust is **SHRI RADHESH KRISHAN, AGE-29, S/O-SHRI ARUN KUMAR CHAUDHARY** shall hold the office at will.

2. The first Managing Trustee shall be the **SETTLOR**, The settler of Trust will be the chairman/ Chairperson of the Trust **SHRI RADHESH KRISHAN,S/O-SHRI ARUN KUMAR CHAUDHARY** is the first Trustee / Settler of the Trust). He will preside all over the meetings and works of the Trust. Final decision of the Trust shall be taken by the Settler and he will hold office for her life time. After the demise or relinquishment of office of the Managing Trustee or in the event of the first Managing Trustee failing to nominate her successor in office, the remaining trustees shall elect one of the other Trustees as Managing Trustee.
3. The term of office of First Trustees shall be for their respective lives or at will. The Board of Trustees shall have the power to increase the total number of Trustees up to the maximum number stated above and fix their term as per provisions contained herein.
4. Any Trustee, including the Managing Trustee may retire from the Trusteeship hereof by giving two calendar months notice in writing of his or her intention to do so, to the Board of Trustees and after the expiry of the period of notice, the Trustee giving the notice shall ipso facto cease to be a Trustee of these presents.
5. Any vacancy caused by death of any one of the First Trustees, or any vacancy caused by the resignation of any of the Trustees, may be filled up by co-option by the Board of Trustees.
6. The Trustees who are not First Managing Trustee or First Trustees shall hold office for a period of one year from their date of appointment by the Trustees. At the end of this one year period, the Board of Trustees may reappoint them for subsequent term or appoint other persons as Trustees in such a manner that the total number of Trustees does not exceed the approved maximum number of Trustees.
7. The Managing Trustee shall have the power to remove a Trustee suffering from physical or mental disability or if he is accused of misfeasance of trust funds or property or misconduct, after satisfying himself on enquiry and such action of the Managing Trustee shall be final.
8. The proceedings of the Board of Trustees shall not in any way be invalidated due to any post or posts remaining vacant. During the time when a vacancy is yet to be filled up, the remaining Trustees shall act as "**Full Board**", subject to the presence of Quorum in the meetings. Any vacancy in the Board of Trustees or illegality in the appointment of Trustees or their proceedings shall not invalidate any prior act or decision of the Board.

VIII. TRUST ADMINISTRATION AND POWER TO THE BOARD:

- A. The Board of Trustees shall have power to:**
1. To administer the Trust, its properties and affairs and do all the things which will fulfill the performance of the objects for which the Trust is established and for this purpose the Board can apply the whole or any part of the Trust property towards the payment of the expenses of the Trust.
 2. The income and the properties of the Trust will be solely utilized towards the objects of the Trust and no portion of it will be utilized for payment to the Settler, or Trustees or their relatives by way of salary, allowances, profit, interest, dividend etc.
 3. To open one or more bank accounts and operate the same or provide for operation of the said accounts by any two among them authorized on their behalf or by the settler.

4. To invest the Trust funds in the manner not prohibited by any provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
5. To execute power of attorney or powers of attorney to any person for the purpose of executing, administering or managing the whole or any part of the Trust for the purpose of all or some among the objects of the Trust.
6. To borrow money with or without security and to repay the same.
7. To receive, collect and enforce recovery of all monies due or payable to the Trust and grant receipts and discharges therefore. To settle, compromise or compound any disputes or refer the same to arbitration or litigation.
8. To appoint lawyer, pleaders, advocates to file and defend suit or suits filed for and against the Trust and or in the name of the Trust and also file suits for financial and other disputes or dues with different parties and signed executed such application, petition documents for such proceedings and delegate powers to the officers(s), employee(s), staff(s) and Trustee(s) for such proceedings(s) as required from time to time.
9. To appoint new member or members of Board of Trustees by a resolution and to discharge any of the Trustee, who become bankrupt or acts in any manner prejudicial to the interest or objects of the Trust or is convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude or becomes of unsound mind or is otherwise unfit to continue as Trustee, by resolution passed by simple majority of members present and voting in the meeting of Board of Trustees.
10. To appoint from time to time on such terms and conditions as they may determine a Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s), Project Co-coordinator and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff for carrying out the activities of the Trust and to remove at any time any such Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s) and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff.
11. The Trustees shall invest the Trust fund in government securities, saving certificates, fixed deposits or invest in the real state/ property in any other form of investment authorized under provisions of INDIAN TRUST ACT and INDIAN INCOME TAX ACT, 1961, as they shall deem expedient.
12. It has further been decided that as and when the Trust is enclosed or dissolved all the funds of the Trust shall be transferred to the other recognized Public Charitable Trust having similar objectives.
13. All questions relating to the management of the Trust or the exercise of the powers vested in the Trust shall be decided at a meeting or, if necessary and expedient, by circulation. Every such question shall be decided by a majority of the Trustees present and voting in any meeting of Board of Trustees or by the circulation, as the case may be and any action or decision of such majority shall be as valid as if it was done or made by the all Trustees. The Chairman / Chairperson shall have a casting vote.
14. To receive voluntary contributions from any person or persons from India or outside, after complying with the statutory formalities, by way of donation, gifts or in any other manner and to hold the same upon Trust for the objects set forth herein.
15. To appoint a managing Trustee, when necessary.
16. To review the affairs of the Trust and a necessary.

To appoint, suspend, dismiss or otherwise deal with the staff required for the administration of the Trust, to frame rules relating to their salaries and other benefits and generally to exercise all powers ancillary and incidental to effectively carry out the objects of the Trust.

18. The Board shall have power to make and rescind rules and regulations for the management and administration of the Trust.
 19. To gift, lease, and transfer the immovable and moveable properties of the Trust
 20. No Trustee shall commit any act or breach of Trust of the Trust fund or property or cause any loss to the Trust property or commit fraud in the administration of the Trust fund / property. To open and to provide for operating banking accounts.
 21. The Trustees shall hold honorary office and shall not be entitled to any Salary, allowances or perquisites, except for the reimbursement of actual expenses incurred in connection with attending to the Trust matters.
 22. The Board of Trustees will follow the instructions given by any donor who makes substantial contribution towards furtherance of the objects of the Trust, so long as such instructions are not detrimental to the attainment of the objects of the Trust and are in conformity with the provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961.
- B. For the management and administration of the Trust, the Trustees shall elect one amongst themselves for each of the offices of The **President, General Secretary, and Treasurer**. The term of office for The President (Settler) shall be for the period of at will from their date of appointment, General Secretary, Joint Secretary and Treasurer shall be for the period of five years and they can be appointed/ elected by the election. The term of election will be five years. The election can be conductive as per resolution pass in the board of trustee meeting.

C. **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND POWERS**

The Roles, Responsibilities and powers of all these officers is defined below. In addition to these, the Managing Trustee may grant additional roles, responsibilities and powers to any of the Trustees.

a) **MANAGING TRUSTEE:**

In addition to discharging normal duties of a trustee, the Managing Trustee shall preside over meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Managing Trustee is authorized to sign all documents, including bank documents, acknowledgements for the contributions received, and agreements with individuals, Government Institutions and other organizations, on behalf of the Board of Trustees. The Managing Trustee shall have all the residuary powers, not explicitly assigned to any of the other officers in these presents.

The Managing Trustee is authorized to sign along with the Treasurer bank cheques, deposit release vouchers etc. The Managing Trustee is empowered to remove any Trustee from the Trust and its offices, if he/she finds that his/her activities are not congenial to the activities of the Trust.

The Managing Trustee is responsible for ensuring that the Trust pursues its Objects and for maintaining the dignity of the Trust organization and shall use his/her influence to promote the activities of the Trust.

- v. In case of exigencies, the President will have the power to take decision on the issue; however, the same will have to be brought to the notice of board of Managing Trustees at the earliest.

The Secretary shall maintain the records of the organization prepare and circulate agenda and minutes of Board of Trustee meeting for the approval of the Managing Trustee.

The Secretary shall be also responsible for the day to day administration activities of the Trust. The Secretary shall deal with correspondence received by the Trust, send replies in consultation with the Managing Trustee, Vice President and/or the Treasurer where necessary. He/she is responsible for the safe custody of all the properties and records of the Trust. The Secretary shall represent the Trust in all legal matters, sign the papers related to legal cases, attend to courts or represent the Trust in Government offices.

d) TREASURER: { ARUN KUMAR CHAUDHARY, AGE-46, S/O-SHRI AMBIKA CHAUDHARY }

The Treasurer will prepare Annual Budget, monthly and yearly expenditure statements get the expenditure audited by auditor duly appointed by the Board of Trustees and place them before the Board of Trustees for approval. The Treasurer is responsible to maintain cash book and prepare vouchers for the payments made, receive contributions, sign acknowledgements for the amounts or articles received by the Trust and prepare monthly and yearly statements of revenue and expenditure, as well as, the register of assets of the Trust and place them before the Board of Trustees for their approval.

The Treasurer is authorized to sign bank cheques, application for drafts and payment instructions jointly with the Managing Trustee and draw money from the bank, up to the limits defined by the Board of Trustees in their meetings. The Treasurer is responsible for safe custody of cash, bonds, securities etc. of the Trust.

IX. MEMBERSHIP

The membership of the trust is open to any person who has attained the age of maturity and every citizens without discrimination of caste, religion, creed or sex fulfills the terms & conditions of the trust but the subject to the approval of the managing board of trustees.

1. ADMISSION FEE & SUBSCRIPTION

The admission fee and the subscription shall be as under otherwise revised by the board of the trustees however the final decision of settler. Admission Fee Rs.199/- at the time of admission for the one year membership for ordinary membership. The member can deposit of Rs 500/- admission fee for

5 years. Rs. 5000/- at the time of admission for two years for associate membership. Rs. 10,000/- (Rs TEN THOUSAND ONLY) at the time of admission for board of trustees willing to help the needy. The membership fee can be changed time to time as per decision taken by the board of trustees. Subscription Rs. 10,000/-(Rs TEN Hundred only) per month for every member including board of trust so as to generate the fund.

2. TERMINATION OR CESSATION OF MEMBERSHIP

The board of the trust shall have the powers to expel/terminate a member or/and members, from the membership of the above trust on the following grounds:

- a) On written resignation on the plane paper.
- b) If found to be involved in any anti social activities. If adjudged by any court of law to be a criminal offender or of unsound mind,
- c) If found guilty by means of anti propaganda of the Aims and Objects of the society.
- d) If fails to pay the subscription of contribution for three months from due dated.
- e) If has not attended three consecutive meeting without proper intimation to the trust.
- f) If disregards Rules and Regulations of trust or disobey the decisions of board of trust.

X. MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

The Board of Trustees should meet at least once in every calendar quarter and may meet more often when required.

- 1) The meeting of Board of Trustees shall be convened by the Managing Trustee and he shall preside over the meetings. In his absence, the Managing Trustee may authorize the Vice President to be the Chairman of such meetings. In the event the Managing Trustee or Vice President are not able to attend the meeting already convened, any of the Trustees present in the meeting may elect one amongst themselves to be the Chairman of the meeting.
- 2) One half of the Board of Trustees or a minimum of two trustees, whichever is higher, shall constitute the QUORUM for the Board of Trustee meetings.
- 3) All decisions shall be carried out by the majority decision of the Board but in the event of equality of votes, the Chairman presiding over the meeting shall have a casting vote.
- 4) Any resolution in writing signed by all the Trustees by circulation shall have equal force as though it has been passed at a meeting of the Board of Trustees.
- 5) The meeting of the Board shall be conveyed after giving at least a week's notice unless all the Trustees agree to accept a shorter notice.
- 6) The Board of Trustees may invite other persons interested in the objects and functioning of the Trust to attend the meetings of the Board, but they shall not be entitled vote in the meetings of the Board.

XI. BANK ACCOUNT:

- i) The Managing Trustee/Settler shall jointly or singly operate Bank Accounts on behalf of the Trust as per resolution passed by the managing / board of trustee. The bank account of the Trust shall be operated settler or any one or jointly

with the settlor. In their absence, any of the Trustees may be authorized by the Board of Trustees, by a resolution passed, to operate the bank accounts. One or more Bank Accounts may be opened in any Bank and or Banks in the name of the Trust.

- ii) All Cheques shall be signed jointly / singly as per resolution passed by the board of Trust.

XII. INVESTMENT OF TRUST FUNDS:

- 1) The Board of Trustees shall have the power to invest the funds, assets and properties of the Trust at their discretion in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 2) The Board shall also determine from time to time, the amount it shall spend on the various activities of the Trust.
- 3) All the income/ fund of the trust shall be deposited in the bank operating.

XIII. ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT:

- 1) The financial year of the Trust shall be from 1st April to 31st March of the following year, unless otherwise decided by the Board of Trustees.
- 2) The Board of Trustees shall maintain true and correct accounts of the Trust.
- 3) The accounts of the Trust shall be annually audited by a Chartered Accountant appointed by the Board of Trustees and the audited statement of account shall be placed before the Board for its approval within three months of the close of the financial year.

XIV. AMENDMENTS

- 1) While this Trust shall be irrevocable, the Board of Trustees may amend any of the clauses except those relating to objects of the Trust, the First Managing Trustee and First Trustees, at a duly convened meeting of the Board with at least 2 weeks' notice, and by a resolution passed by at least three-fourths majority of the Board of Trustees present and voting. The amendments to the Trust deed can only be passed by a resolution of the Board of Trustees in an actual meeting and not by circulation.
- 2) If any alteration or amendment is necessary, the same shall be affected through supplementary deed/deeds with the previous approval of the Commissioner of Income Tax and these shall be read together with the main Trust deed.

XV. INDEMNITY:

The Board of Trustees shall be indemnified for any act done by them in good faith in the course of the administration of the Trust. The Chairman and the Trustees acting in relation to any of the affairs of the Trust in good faith shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Trust from and against all suits, proceedings, costs, charges, losses, damages and expenses which they or any of them shall or may incur or sustain by reason of any act done or omitted in or about the execution of their duty in their respective offices or trusts and no Trustees shall be answerable for the acts, receipt, neglects or defaults of any other such persons or Trustees with whom any money or effects belonging to the Trust may be lodged or deposited

XVI. SETTLOR AND THEIR RELATIVES:

Notwithstanding the powers vested with the Trustees under the proceeding clause, no part of the income of the Trust shall benefit directly or indirectly the trustees and no part of the income of the property of the Trust shall be used or applied directly or indirectly for the benefit of:

- (a) **SETTLOR, Managing Trustee, Trustees** or any person who makes a substantial contribution to the Trust or of any relative of the **SETTLOR, Managing Trustee, Trustees** or the person who makes a substantial contribution.
- (b) Any "related concern" in which any of the above persons has substantial interest.
- (c) For the purpose of this clause, the word "relative" and the phrases "related concern", "substantial interest" and "substantial contribution" shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

XVII. APPLICABILITY OF TRUST ACT

The provisions of the Indian Trust Act 1882 shall apply to all matters not specifically mentioned in these presents.

XVIII. APPLICATION OF INCOME TAX ACT:

All clauses herein are intended to secure exemption from Income Tax on the income of contributions and donations to the Trust and any clause or portion of this Deed of Trust which is inconsistent with or repugnant to the sections of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended, substituted or modified from time to time, shall be deemed to be deleted or modified with effect from the date on which the sections to which the clause or part of a clause is repugnant or inconsistent comes into force.

XIX. THIS TRUST IS DECLARED IRREVOCABLE:

The Trust form is irrevocable.

XX. BENEFIT OF THE TRUST OPEN TO ALL:

Benefit of Trust open to all irrespective of cast, creed, religion or sex.

XXI. DISSOLUTION:

In the event of dissolution of the Trust, the entire Trust funds shall be realized and first be used for payment of liabilities of the Trust. The assets left if any, shall be disbursed to other Trusts or Associations having similar objectives after obtaining previous approval of Commissioner of Income-tax and in no event it shall be distributed in any manner, to any of the Board of Trustees or their relatives or related concerns.

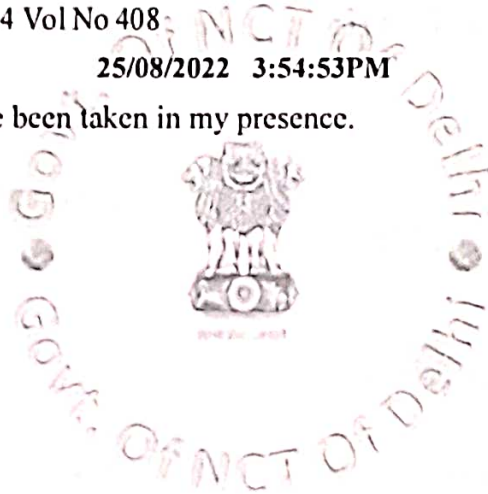
